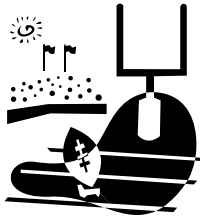

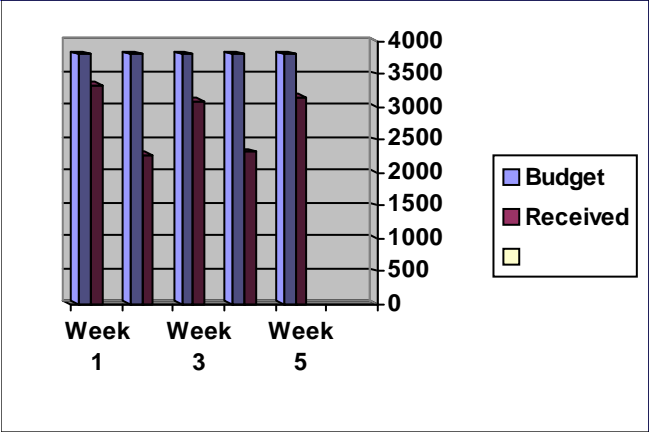

From the Missions Ministry

The Christian Support Center

Dan Moran and I worked at the Food Pantry on the Thursday prior to Thanksgiving. It was a very busy 2 hours, and we were not the only volunteers there that evening. Everyone stayed very busy. Unfortunately, there are still a lot of people in need of food assistance in our immediate area. Libby Hammond, who manages the pantry, told me that the pantry serves an average of 250 families a month. That number has been consistent for the past several years.

The Christian Support Center (one of several food pantries in the county) is located in the St. Mark’s Episcopal Church at 710 East Buchanan Street. The pantry operates under the direction of the Plainfield Church Federation. The hours are Wednesdays from 9 to 11:50 a.m., Thursdays from 5 to 6 p.m., and Saturdays from 9 to 11:50 a.m. The pantry provides a meal on Wednesdays at the cost of \$4.00 or any amount a family can afford. This money helps support the pantry.

The pantry also has a used clothing store and people pay a small amount for what they need.

The pantry is supported by individuals, churches, and sometimes local businesses. They also receive some help from Government Surplus (Gleaners Food Bank). The Christian Support Center is one of the missions supported by Center Community Church. Donations are welcome anytime. To make a donation, you can call the main office at (317) 839-6730. Donations can be taken to St. Mark’s during their open hours which are: Monday through Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to Noon.

Items needed for the pantry—Food items: Hot and cold cereals, peanut butter, macaroni and cheese, muffin mixes, crackers, macaroni, instant potatoes and Hamburger Helper

Canned goods needed: corn, green beans, peas, tomatoes, pork and beans and pasta sauce

Paper products: toilet paper (individually wrapped rolls) and paper towels

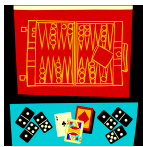
