The Cost of Freedom

The 4th of July is a holiday in which we celebrate our nation's freedom—our independence. When we celebrate, we have cookouts and set off fireworks. And we say, "God bless America!" When we think of the freedom that we have in America, do we think to ask the questions: "What is the cost of freedom?" "Is it worth the cost?" According to the statistics that I read, the 4,491 U.S. soldiers that have died in Iraq thought it was worth the cost. 2,229 of their brothers who died in Afghanistan thought it was worth the cost. In fact, freedom has cost the United States of America 1,354,664 of it's most precious commodity—soldiers that are willing to die for our freedom. They thought it was worth the cost. And as we see, freedom isn't free. It cost dearly.

Your freedom from sin cost dearly also. It cost Jesus His place in Heaven for 33 years. It cost Him tremendous suffering and agony until He finally gave His all on the cross that we might have freedom from the condemnation of Hell. Yes, freedom isn't free. All you have to do is walk among the grave markers of Arlington to understand that. You don't have to travel to Arlington National Cemetery to understand the cost of freedom. Just come to Center Community Church. You'll find it there. There you will see the cross. There you will understand the cost of freedom. There you will understand that Christ thought you were worth the cost.

Worth Fighting For

As I write this, it is Flag Day which is to remember the adoption of the Flag of the US in 1777. On June 14, 1916, President Wilson issued the Proclamation to commemorate the US Flag. This year marks the Centennial Celebration. Congress finally passed it into law in 1949; however, as an observance and not a holiday. The Flag is now a Supreme Court Issue. In 1989, the Supreme Court decided that burning the Flag was a free speech issue breaking with almost 200 years of tradition that the Flag is a protected item. I remember as a Boy Scout learning the proper way to burn the American Flag, and this was not it.

The concept of Freedom of Religion is also under such attack as the Flag. The 1st amendment of the Bill of Rights states that the government it prohibited from making a law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof. According to the Pew Research Center's Religion and Public Life Project, the US puts a "moderate" restriction on religious freedom. For example if a church accepts federal funding or claims a tax-exempt status, then the church is not allowed to talk about politics from the pulpit or endorse a candidate. Yet we hear about candidates going to church and speaking in front of that congregation. Is it allowed for some, but not all? Is this being selectively prosecuted? In the 1800's, a Church took a stand on candidates and now it is prohibited from doing so.

I go back to John 3:16 when it states: "¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. This is a gift from God that cannot and will not be taken away. No matter what our government does as long as we know Jesus Christ, we know we are safe and have a place with Him in Heaven.

I was going to bring up where it states in Luke 20:24-25 that the Pharisees tried to trick Jesus about paying taxes to Caesar. Jesus asks who is on the coin, and they stated "Caesar" Then he said to pay Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's. Jesus made His stand and again the Pharisees were hushed and backed down.

We need to make a stand for ourselves and not let the government dictate who and what we are. God has already done that for us!



"SHALL"

"Shall" is a word you'll find in many legal documents. It's even in our Constitution as a definitive guarantee of whatever rights there are being addressed. This word was used to ensure that the message was clear and would not be changed. The phrase comes from the Bible, and notably the King James (1611 Authorized). Many translations we have today have replaced "shall" with "will" and the meaning and message remain exactly the same. However, I like the word "shall," because with it comes a true sense of assurance and certainty. (It's like the word "will" on steroids)

In John 11, Jesus is speaking with Martha, the sister of Lazarus (who had just passed away), and He tells her this: "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in Me shall live, even though they die. Everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" (Verses 25&26)

Jesus was giving a definite statement in what he told Martha. This was not something Jesus said "will be" or "will come," but rather He is saying "it is." Jesus knew the power His resurrection would bring. He knew that by His death, burial, and resurrection, death itself would be humiliated and Satan himself would be made into a public spectacle in front of all the heavenly hosts. (Colossians 2:6-15)

For those in Christ are walking with Christ and are alive in Christ. Here Jesus is giving an absolute statement, which the Apostle Paul echoed in 1 Corinthians 15, that sin, death, and Satan have no power whatsoever over those in Christ. Remember, the Lord is not the God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive. (Luke 20:38).

I write this to myself, because I know there are many things in this life for which we do not have the answers and that we never will understand on this side of life. Yet, there is one thing we know with certainty, one thing that we know can never be snatched from us by any force. The word "shall."

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever would believe in Him, SHALL not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

Permit me to leave with an excerpt from my favorite Brit Lit Poet, John Donne, in "Death be not Proud":

"One short sleep past, we wake eternally,

And death **shall** be no more, Death, thou shalt die." In Christ, Luke

12th Annual Pop Tab & Coin Drop on Monument Circle


