What is Your Colt?

Over the years I have loaned out videos, teaching materials and books. While I know I should write down who borrows what, I don't really worry about it, and I would probably lose the paper that I wrote it down on. So if I take inventory, I can think of several videos and books that I am missing and have no clue as to who has them. But someone had a need for the item, and I helped fill that need. After all, I am just a trustee of the things God has entrusted to me. I read the following text, and it got me to thinking.

Mark 11:1-6 As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'" They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go.

We don't know anything about the people who owned the colt that Jesus used. All we know is that Jesus had a use for their property and once they heard that Jesus needed it, they simply let the colt go. How awesome is that?! So I ask you, "What is your colt?" How many people in our church if you walked up to them and said, "The Lord needs your car.," would simply let you drive away? Actually I can think of several. We need to have that type of mindset. That whether it is a car, finances, food or personal time, we are not property owners. We are not wealth accumulators. We are caretakers of what God has placed in our care. So when the Master comes and asks, we do not hesitate, but let it go. Just as Jesus said to the disciples, "*The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.*" God may use it, but it will come back to us one way or another.

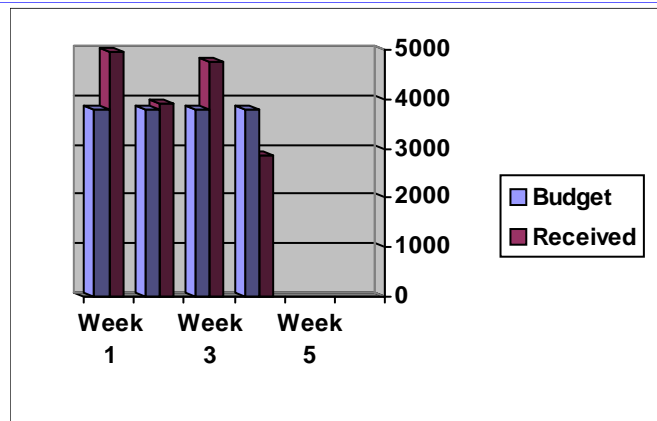

WHEELER MISSION

In choosing to support a Mission, our church considers if the work is being done in Jesus’ name. We are proud to support Wheeler Mission in Indianapolis as one of the thirteen missions CCC helps to support. Wheeler Mission was founded in 1893 by a group of women who wanted to help the poor by providing food, shelter, and life skills training. More than a century later, Wheeler Mission continues to provide long term solutions to poverty and homelessness.

Homeless shelters offer men, women and mothers with children, meals, lodging, clothing and shower facilities. Case management, job and housing procurement, access to legal aid, educational opportunities, counseling, and medical clinics are also available.

All of their guests receive intentional spiritual training throughout their stay at Wheeler. Thousands of people received food, shelter, and care at Wheeler Mission throughout the year in 2014 and the blessings of 1,700 plus spiritual commitments were made.

Most recently on Easter Sunday, CCC gave an offering of love, from the story in the Bible of Judas’, 30 pieces of silver. 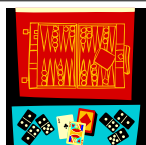
