The Folly of Preaching

A Church goer wrote a letter to the editor of a newspaper and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday. "I've gone for 30 years now," he wrote, "and in that time I have heard something like 3,000 sermons. But for the life of me, I can't remember a single one of them. So, I think I'm wasting my time and the preachers are wasting theirs by giving sermons at all."

This started a real controversy in the "Letters to the Editor" column. Much to the delight of the editor, it went on for weeks until someone wrote this clincher: "I've been married for 30 years now. In that time my wife has cooked some 32,000 meals. But, for the life of me, I cannot recall the entire menu for a single one of those meals.

But I do know this...They all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today!"

I have preached at Center Community Church now for 9 years. During that time I have written and shared approximately 462 sermons. If I asked you which sermon was the best, I doubt if many or any of you could say. In fact, I imagine that most of you can't remember what I preached on last Sunday. So what is the point?

I don't know how many times I have heard my very words come out of your mouths. I have had some of you share a great spiritual truth with me that you have come to understand, without you realizing that I was the one who shared that truth with you.

You may not be able to quote a sermon outline without looking at Sunday's sermon notes, but God is using each method to influence you to become who you should be. So when you are trying to decide whether or not you want to come to church on any given Sunday, remember that at Center Community Church you are being fed through classes, singing, meditations and preaching. When you do not come, you are effectively causing yourself to be spiritually malnourished.

Dear Church Family,

You Might Be Surprised...

I know we have a Church wanting to learn more about God and His role in our life and His plan for us. You can see it by the way people are diligently taking notes during the sermon and listening closely to what is being said.

I would challenge each of you to bring that same determination and willingness to learn to Sunday School. I am going to dispel some misconceptions.

- 1) You believe that Sunday School is only for little children. I can tell you that is incorrect! Currently we have more adults coming to class than youth. This could be an opportunity to have a family event and come to Sunday School as a family and after church ask each other what you learned. Yesterday was Grandparent's Day at Church, and it came to me as a great chance for the Grandparents to demonstrate the need to come and learn together.
- 2) You went to Sunday School as a youth and know all the stories really? I pride myself on being very knowledgeable on U.S. History, but I know I have only touched the surface of what I could know. I know when I come to Sunday School, I am going to learn something new. And it has never failed me! I look at it this way, if Chuck Elston can keep coming to Sunday School, and I wish I just knew half of what he knows, then I still need to learn also.
- 3) You read # 2 and still believe you can read the Bible at home and get the same thing you would get at Church! I will take our class as an example. We never "rubber stamp" the material and go forward. We discuss it, and, yes, it may take the entire class time on that one point. I always hear a different perspective, and some people will be surprised at this coming from me, but I try and keep an open mind to their ideas as well.

I look forward to our class every Sunday and while I was sick, I hated missing class.

I want our youth to hate missing Sunday School class also, but I believe this comes from the top. I hope to get our adults excited which gets their children and/or grandchildren excited. This excitement will trickle



WRE is a Christian-based non-profit, non-denominational program with the Weekday Religious Education Association in the public schools. With parents' written permission, the children are released for a specified time. Boys and girls in the fourth grade go to WRE classes for religious instruction in nearby churches. WRE is operated by the Federation of Churches in Plainfield.

Lisa Troupe currently directs this program that transports 4th grade students from Plainfield Elementary Schools for a one-hour program each Tuesday. To accommodate the 285 enrolled students, they arrive in four different shifts for Biblical instruction and songs.

Students help others in different projects like the food drive for the Christian Support Center and writing cards to military and missionaries. Students learn Bible verses, songs and how to help others. It is a great outreach program for Christ and a great way to teach good solid Biblical values.


